Location of Happy valley



- Located at the outskirts of Kotagiri village near the KMF hospital.
- Panchayat land 1 acres
- Prime source of water for the households living downstream and the hills surrounding it.
- The source of the wetland is a spring which runs off, as a small stream.
- A part of the catchment area has been fenced. However, fencing has been violated in parts has become a central dumping yard and a centre for attending nature's call.
- Vegetation:-
 - Shrubs like Lantana sp., Eupotorium sp., Cestrum sp., Solanum sp., Ricinus sp. and Pteris sp. - Colonisers.
 - Along the course of the stream Polygonum sp. Cyathea spp. were found.
 - The agriculture belt had Rumex sp. and Plantago sp.
- Tea with silver oak plantation is seen in the upland portion of the wetland.



In to Action...


- To raise awareness the following action points were decided upon:
 - A walk through the wetland was planned
 - As part of the restoration initiative, a nursery on Shola and wetland plants was developed in the campus.
 - Garbage was collected











- Trees: Ligustrum perrottetii, Syzygium sp.
 Elaeocarpus variabilis, Turpinia nepalensis,
 Daphniphyllum neilgherrense
- Liana: *Elaeagnus kologa*
- Total planted 600
- Survived 487
